



Carey is the artistic director and co-founder of Theatre 3x60, a professional not for profit company enriching lives through theatre in Durham region. She has been engaged in performing arts for over 40 years, starting with community theatre in St.Catharines, Ontario. She moved to Toronto to pursue professional dance studies with Lois Smith, O.C. at George Brown



College, and the School of the Toronto Dance Theatre, graduating from both professional programs and becoming a faculty member at STDT for 15 years before moving to Durham region. She has been involved with community and professional theatre companies in Durham, York region and elsewhere as a board member, producer, director, choreographer, performer, instructor, set and costume designer. Carey is a past Executive Director of the Scugog Council for the Arts and has received several awards for her work in the performing arts, including a Durham Art of Transition Creative Award for her contribution to theatre in Durham. Her past, and ongoing, theatre studies include programs and courses with George Brown College, Toronto Dance Theatre, Tarragon Theatre and the Stratford Festival, among others. Carey is also a member of the Theatre Ontario Talent Bank, an independent theatre adjudicator, and arts educator.

## FESTIVAL ADJUDICATOR'S WORKSHOP KEEPING THE PLAY IN THE PLAY

Wednesday, March 14, 2018 1:30 p.m.

Before the play goes on stage, there are rehearsals. All too often, somewhere in that process, the play becomes work. This workshop offers ideas and exercises for working creatively to build text, sub-text and physicality in rehearsal to bring more energy and depth to the performance.

Whether the goal is lighthearted farce or dark tragedy, a playful, creative approach to rehearsal engages actors, giving them permission and opportunity to continually to explore their world and character. Working outside of the lines and stage directions can enrich the actors' process, provide greater, richer material for the director to work with and invest the production with a strong sense of ensemble. The end result – an empowered, committed cast, a well realized vision and a satisfied audience.

#### CAROLEE MASON - PRE-FESTIVAL ADJUDICATOR

Carole is an award winning drama educator, author and director, and an adjudicator with the EODL, ACT-CO, WODL and Sears Drama Festivals. Her decades of theatre work have taken her to venues throughout Ontario. Based at both the Mason Theatre and the Studio Theatre in Perth, Ontario, she has directed and designed dozens of productions for youth and adults. Carolee has instructed students, community theatre groups and teachers across the province, most recently at Brock University and the

University of Toronto. A workshop presenter for theatre educators in Ontario and abroad, she has authored a range of resource materials for students and theatre practitioners. Carolee's work has been recognized with the Governor General's Teaching Award, and Theatre Ontario's Michael Spence Award.

#### PREFESTIVAL ADJUDICATOR'S WORKSHOP

The Stage Manager's Prompt Book: Building An Effective Resource for Calling your Show Friday, March16, 2018 1:30 p.m.

Are you a stage manager who'd like to hone your skills? Are you a director who'd like to develop a common language with your production staff? Are you a technician with an urge to assume more responsibility? Are you an actor with a desire to understand more of what goes on behind the scenes?

Any of you will enjoy this hands-on workshop in which you will learn how to build and format a prompt book to a professional standard. We will work with a script segment that includes dialogue and blocking notes, and will explore strategies for incorporating a variety of lighting changes, sound cues, and special effects, for use in "calling cues" for your show. Once you have acquired this skill set, you will never see a late cue again!





## CAROLINE SMITH PLAY READING WORKSHOP

Caroline Smith has enjoyed as successful 35-year career in professional theatre as a performer, choreographer, director and playwright. She has worked in almost every theatre in Canada, including the Canadian Opera Company, the Shaw Festival and the Charlottetown Festival.

Caroline will be reading the first act from her newly published play TO DIE FOR A twisting, turning comedy-thriller, similar in style to Deathtrap and Sleuth, but with two very intelligent and charismatic female combatants – and one devastatingly handsome man.




#### SET BUILDING TECHNIQUES AND SCENIC TECHNOLOGYWORKSHIP



#### Venus in Fur

Written by David Ives
Directed by Ryan Bassett

Thomas Novachek is a playwright. His latest play is an adaptation of the 19th century erotic German novel, Venus In Furs by Leopold von Sacher-Masoch. He has spent the day auditioning actresses for the role of Vanda von Dunayev, to, as he feels, little success. He opens the play bemoaning the pool of auditioners, deriding their intelligence, their ability, their looks, their 'femininity', or (by his estimation) lack thereof.

Vanda Jordan is an aspiring actress. Due to an impossible string of bad luck, she is running late to her audition. She is determined to get the part, and presses on, even though her audition was hours ago.

Vanda appears to Thomas as the epitome of all his frustration; she's crass, she's loud. She lacks the grace and dignity Thomas feels his character possesses.

Wanting to get home, Thomas tries desperately to get her to leave, but perhaps out of pity, or because she simply won't let up, he agrees to let her audition for the part, remaining confident in his assessment that she is no different from the other women he has seen. Until she begins to read.



#### RICHARD HOWARD

June 29, 1932- April 16, 2017

Richard was born in Port Huron, Michigan and then as a very young boy, moved to Sarnia. In an interview called "The Oral History-Life in the Arts", Richard was asked how the arts came into his life to which he said this: "At the age of 13 or so, I saw an



ad in the local paper for auditions and they needed 2 young boys.....I went and immediately felt like I was home.....I felt accepted, that I belonged, that I could express myself...it was a land full of imagination and creativity......my upbringing as an artist and as a person began at Sarnia Little Theatre (now Theatre Sarnia)...This is where I was born....."


Because of how he was treated by the wonderful people at this theatre, Richard committed his life to the arts. As a theatre director and acting coach, Richard worked in over 50 communities in Ontario alone, as well as many cities throughout Canada, U.S.A., England, France, Germany and Australia. During his 65 year career, Richard received over 200 special recognitions for his creative and innovative approach to his work. Some highlights include awards for his Outstanding Contributions to Theatre from the City of Toronto, Province of Ontario, Arts Council of Ontario, Sault Ste. Marie Community Recognition Award and Theatre Ontario's Maggie Bassett Award. He was also the founder and creator of Pull Chain Theatre in Sault Saint Marie where over a hundred works from Shakespeare and Chekhov right down to Broadway musicals were performed at both the Purple Lantern and the Windsor Park.

Richard was married for 32 years to internationally acclaimed Russian actress Lila Kedrova, who won an Oscar for the motion picture Zorba the Greek and a Tony for the Broadway musical production of Zorba.

Thank you Theatre Sarnia for giving birth to this theatre giant's creative force.

And to quote Richard: "We love it when you come to the theatre!"






## Interface Testing Services Inc.

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








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
